## Council News

### Bills

After 2 years of many struggling to pay bills, we hope that this year will be different. The Council expect fewer problems this year and hope most will be sorted by April 1<sup>st</sup>. It is likely that the deadline for these will be much sooner this year, so please pay promptly.

One change introduced by the government requires multi factor authentication for online payments. You will receive a call or text to give a code. If you have changed your mobile number you will need to inform the council or let me know and I will pass it on.

**If you pay by phone you won't have to do this.**

### IAS membership and insurance

Public liability is something all plot holders **must** have, according to allotment rules. Just over half of you have taken this out by joining IAS, which is still the cheapest way. Those of you who do not will have to provide documented evidence of this to the council in the future (household insurance does not cover this).

### Changes to clearing plots

While most plots are fine, some are left in a bad way when plot holders move on. All kinds of items/rubbish/overgrown plots are left behind, and this has to be cleared. In the future the Council are planning to charge plot holders a **minimum of £250** if clearance is required. Please be aware of this. And remove anything you no longer need.

### Field inspections

Allotment fields across Ipswich will be inspected during the next few weeks to check that people are working within the rules.
